We are told in Numbers 28:16 that the remembrance of (1 across) takes place on the 14th of the month.

In verse 17 we are told of a feast that follows the above remembrance. In this feast

Many modern Bible versions use the word "Passover" at (4 across). The problem is that Passover had already taken place.

At that time the pagan holiday of Easter was celebrated later

which lasts for 7 days, the instructions from the Lord are to eat (2 across) (3 across).

The above feast is again referred to in Acts 12:3 when it is used to set a time period in which Peter is taken captive. In this verse the feast is referred to as (1 down) (2 down) (3 down) (4 down) (5 down) (6 down) (7 down).

Acts 12:4 tells us that Herod intended to bring Peter forth to the people after (4 across).

The Greek word "Pascha" can be translated as either "Passover" or "Easter." The King James Bible translates this word as "Passover" 28 times. However, in this one instance it is correctly translated as "Easter."
